Preventing HIV transmission, saving lives, reducing health care costs

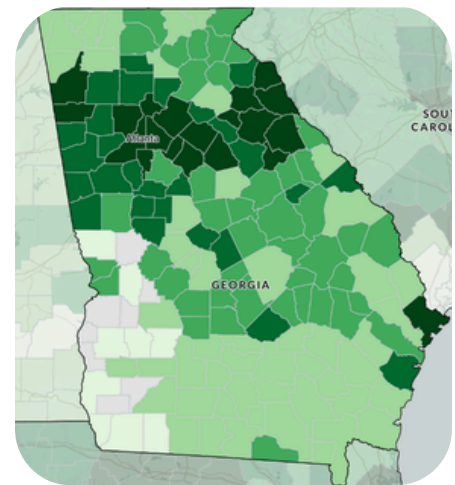
Georgia funding

- CDC total (FY 2023): \$661 million
- HIV, viral hepatitis, STI & TB prevention funding (FY 2023): \$58,172,492
- HIV prevention funding (FY 2024): \$42.4 million
- Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) funding (FY 2024): \$19,100,000

In Georgia, *only 29.2% of individuals who could benefit from PrEP* are prescribed medications for PrEP.

PrEP is *99% effective* at preventing HIV acquisition.

Every HIV transmission prevented saves *\$500,000 to \$1.1 million in lifetime health care costs.*



Rates of Persons Using PrEP per 100k, 2024

18 59 86 117 153

Impacts of HIV prevention funding:

- 89% of funding goes to health departments & community-based organizations
- A 12% decline in new cases from 2018 to 2022, saving between \$5 billion - \$10 billion in lifetime health care costs
- Critical infrastructure support for viral hepatitis, STIs and TB prevention
